RECREATION SITES WITH CAMPING



19 CRESCENT BAR RECREATION AREA

55-site reservation campground with full hook-ups and vehicle/boat trailer parking. Golf course, two boat launches, day-use and commercial marina, floating fuel station, walking/biking trails, sheltered picnic areas, playground, sports courts (pickleball and basketball), and multiple beach areas.



4 PRIEST RAPIDS RECREATION AREA

14-site reservation campground with no hook-ups. Three-lane boat launch, walking/biking trails, sheltered picnic areas, and swim beach.



14 SAND HOLLOW RECREATION AREA

40-site reservation campground with no hook-ups. 10 campsites are walk-in only. Sheltered picnic areas and swim beach.



16 ROCKY COULEE RECREATION AREA

10-site first-come, first served campground with no hook-ups. All sites are walk-in only. Hand boat launch, sheltered picnic area, and primitive trail.



1 JACKSON CREEK FISH CAMP

10-site first-come, first served campground with no hook-ups. Sheltered picnic area and walk-in fishing access.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where can I park overnight?

Overnight parking is limited to designated campground sites.

Is there anywhere I can have a fire when the Grant County burn ban is in effect?

Grant PUD only allows campfires during the county burn ban at Crescent Bar and Priest Rapids Recreation Area campgrounds within the fire rings at each site and at the Sand Hollow day-use area in the grills provided. Portable propane grills and propane fire pits are always allowed within Grant PUD Parks.

Can I use a buoy off the shoreline?

Permanent buoys along the shoreline are not allowed without written permission. Temporary buoys are allowed but must be removed when the watercraft is not present. Grant PUD will remove all unattended buoys without notice.

Fluctuating water levels should be considered when temporarily mooring a vessel.

Where can I camp on Grant PUD land outside of designated campgrounds?

Camping outside of developed camping areas requires written permission from Grant PUD.

Is hunting allowed on Grant PUD land?

Hunting is allowed on Grant PUD lands within certain land use classifications. Hunting is allowed within the Resource Management and Project Facilities classifications unless access is prohibited. Hunting within the Public Recreation Development classification is prohibited except for at the Buckshot Recreation Area hunting blind. Land use classifications can be found in the Shoreline Management Plan -

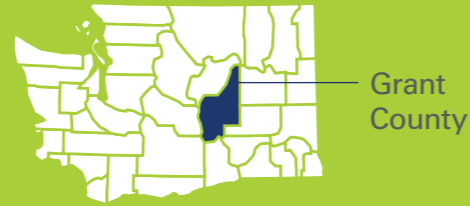

WEAR IT

Ensure everyone in the boat is properly wearing their life jacket.



STAY AFLOAT

Water levels can change suddenly without warning. Be aware of exposed hazards.



LOOKOUT FOR BARRIERS

Floating safety barriers are above both dams. Passing these markers is dangerous and not allowed.



WATCH THE FORECAST

Weather conditions can change quickly. Beware of high winds and strong waves.



PACK IT OUT

Please gather your trash and work to keep our sites clean. Pack it in, pack it out.
